TENNESSEE CAPITOL REPORT is a new 30 minute show airing statewide on Tennessee's Public Television stations covering the newsmakers and issues facing the State Legislature. The first episode, airing on Sunday morning, March 1st, features interviews with Lt. Governor Ron Ramsey and House Speaker Beth Harwell providing an overview of the 109th General Assembly.

"We asked them both a wide range of questions," said Nashville producer Tim Weeks. "From the failure of the Governor's 'Insure Tennessee' plan in the special session to the weather that created havoc across the state last week, both Ramsey and Harwell were candid and personal when speaking to the issues," he said.
